



PE and Sport Grant

The PE and Sport Grant for the 2013 to 2014 academic year is funded over two instalments as follows:

Financial Year	2013/14 Academic Year:	Payment Date
2013-14	September 2013 to March 2014	1 October 2013
2014-15	April 2014 to August 2014	1 May 2014

The funding is paid pursuant to Section 14 of the Education Act 2002, and in accordance with Section 16 of that Act the Secretary of State lays down the following terms and conditions on which the funding is given.

Purpose of the grant

This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2013 to 2014 academic year so that they develop healthy lifestyles. Basis of allocation

Allocations for the academic year 2013/14 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Year R, as recorded on January 2013 Census (referred to as “eligible pupils” below), as follows:

- Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil; and
- Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £500 per eligible pupil.

In the case of a new school which opens during the 2013-2014 financial year, and did not have data for eligible pupils on the January 2013 census, an allocation will be made in December 2013 on the above formula but based on eligible pupils recorded on the autumn 2013 School Census.

Conditions

The grant must be spent on improving the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

Academies must publish, on their website, information about their use of the PE and Sport Grant allocation by 4 April 2014. Academies should publish the amount of grant received; how it has been spent (or will be spent) and what impact the school has seen on pupils’ PE and sport participation and attainment as a result, to help to ensure that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

If an academy fails to comply with the conditions set out in the paragraphs 4 and 5, the Secretary of State may require the repayment of the whole or any part of the funding paid to the academy as may be determined by the Secretary of State and notified in writing to the a. Such sum as has been notified shall immediately become payable to the Secretary of State.
